REPEATER UPDATE:

Note: Carl N1FY and Rob Macedo KD1CY will be giving a SkyWarn presentation. Next year it returns to the Boxboro area and will occur every year rather than every other year. Jeff tells us many vendors will be there along w/seminars and a flea market.

<u>ARRL</u>

The September copy of QST should be in your mailbox shortly. Please pay special attention to the editorial on Page 9 from Dave Sumner, K1ZZ, regarding The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2014 (or H.R. 4969) that was recently introduced in the US House of Representatives.

This legislation offers Amateur Radio the best chance for us to deal with antenna restrictions in decades. While PRB-1 has been very effective in dealing with local, state and federal restrictions for

private property, it did not address the needs of the thousands of licensed hams living in property (~25 million housing units nationwide) restricted by CC&Rs (covenants, conditions, and restrictions) that are

usually present in condominium and subdivisions. HR-4969 will open the door to discussions about reasonable accommodation. Two New England House members have already signed on as co-sponsors,

Joe Courtney from Connecticut's 2nd District and Peter Welch, member-at-large from Vermont. There are nineteen other House members in New England that are potential co-sponsors and we should be asking all of them for their support. W1AW Centennial Operations Relocate on August 13 (UTC)

The ARRL Centennial <u>W1AW WAS</u> operations taking place throughout 2014 from each of the 50 states are now in Vermont (W1AW/1) and New Jersey (W1AW/2). They will relocate at 0000 UTC on Wednesday, August 13 (the evening of August 12 in US time zones), to Oklahoma (W1AW/5). Only one state will be active during the week of August 13-19.

During 2014 W1AW will be on the air from every state (at least twice) and most US territories, and it will be easy to work all states solely by contacting W1AW portable operations.

Maritime Mobile Service Network Aids in Separate Land-Based Emergencies

While best known for its efforts to aid voyagers on the high seas, the Maritime Mobile Service Network (<u>MMSN</u>) occasionally helps out in land-based emergencies too. That was the case recently when MMSN net control stations received distress calls regarding motor vehicle incidents in Nevada and Texas. On July 24, MMSN Net Control Station Ken Porter, ACOML, was notified by HF mobile operator George Molnar, KF2T, that he had witnessed a tractor-trailer mishap on Nevada Highway 318. The rig had apparently skidded and landed on its side in a canyon, precluding the use of cell phone or Amateur Radio VHF/UHF systems.



"Truckers' CBs didn't reach anyone outside the canyon. Only ham radio worked!" Molnar said later.

Porter placed the net in emergency status, pinned down details on the wreck, and notified authorities. Nevada Highway Patrol troopers were dispatched to the scene. There were no injuries, but the highway was completely blocked in both directions, and some of the tractor-trailer's perishable cargo ended up scattered on the roadway.

SKYWARN Volunteers Muster as Severe Weather, Tornado Hit Southern New England

When severe weather erupted in Southern New England on July 27 and 28, SKYWARN

volunteers went on alert to help forecasters track conditions and, afterward, to assist authorities with assessing damage. A super-cell storm system organized over northern Norfolk County, Massachusetts, on the morning of July 28 and raced through portions of northeastern Massachusetts, causing wind damage in sections of Needham, SKYWARN Coordinator and ARRL Eastern Massachusetts Assistant Section Emergency Coordinator Rob Macedo, KD1CY, reported.

"The storm was tracked using the SKYWARN selfactivation protocol," he said. The system subsequently generated an EF-2 tornado, which swept through Revere, Massachusetts, leaving a swath of significant damage in its wake. "Within 15 or 20 minutes of the storm's passage, the Amateur Radio SKYWARN network received reports of



many trees and wires down and structural damage in Revere," Macedo said. "Other pockets of straight-line wind damage and flash flooding occurred elsewhere in Southern New England, rounding out a 2-day stretch of severe weather in the region."

SKYWARN Spotters Jim Palmer, KB1KQW, and Marek Kozubal, KB1NCG, worked with <u>National Weather Service-Taunton</u> Warning Coordination Meteorologist Glenn Field,

KB1GHX, local first responders, and Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency personnel in surveying the damage. All are associated with <u>WX1BOX</u>, the Amateur Radio Station at NWS-Taunton.

WRTC 2014 It's Official: N6MJ and KL9A Take WRTC-2014 Gold, Slovak and German Teams Win Silver and Bronze

After considerable deliberation over which team placed third in the 2014 World Radiosport Team Championship (<u>WRTC-2014</u>), it's now <u>official</u>. At the awards ceremony July 14 concluding the international Amateur Radio contesting competition, the US team of Dan Craig, N6MJ, and Chris Hurlbut, KL9A, operating as K1A, took home the gold for their winning team effort. They racked up 7,184,844 points. There was little suspense about the top spot; Craig and Hurlbut had led the international pack of 59 competing teams literally from the start.

Walking away with the silver was the Slovakia team of Rastislav Hrnko, OM3BH, and Jozef Lang, OM3GI, who operated as W1L and logged 6,816,144 points. Hrnko, 46,

Determining who landed in third place was not so simple, but in the final analysis, the W1P team of Manfred Wolf, DJ5MW, and Stefan von Baltz, DL1IAO, won the bronze medal with 6,421,383 points. The duo had ranked fifth in the "raw, unchecked claimed scores."

Chief Judge David Sumner, K1ZZ, who was master of ceremonies for the awards presentations, said there was "a lot of pressure" on the judges to get it right, and they had to carefully scrutinize the logs of those placing the third, fourth, and fifth in the claimed scores.Because the skills of the operators were so high, the judges had a very, very difficult time resolving the position for number 3," Sumner told the gathering. "We went to extraordinary lengths, given the time that we had available, checking logs. As a matter of fact, had we not checked to the depth that we did, the error rate at W1P would actually have been a bit lower."

"In the end," Sumner said, "there were 8000 points separating number 4 from number 3. That's six-tenths of a multiplier." Wolf and von Baltz edged out fourth-place finishers Kevin Stockton, N5DX, and Steve London, N2IC, who operated as W1Z and garnered 6,413,056 points.

Rob has served three different Section Managers over nearly a decade, and he's earned well-deserved accolades both locally and nationally--not only from the ARRL, but also, from the National Weather Service and several other served agencies.

We're very fortunate to have Mike Neilsen, W1MPN back in the SEC role. Mike brings years of experience to the position, having previously served multiple terms as both our Section Emergency Coordinator and Section Manager. Mike Neilsen is retired from the US Navy, and an engineering and management consulting firm executive career. He's a professional meteorologist by training, and he holds a degree in history. W1MPN has over 45 years of military, maritime, and US Coast Guard communication operator experience. As a naval communications officer, Mike Neilsen was "responsible for all shipboard real time long haul HF communications with on-line cryptology, including the translation to satellite communication systems."

Although we're losing KD1CY as SEC, I'm pleased to report that Rob has agreed to accept an appointment as an Assistant SEC. Under Mike, Rob will continue in his leadership role with our SKYWARN program. He'll also interface with the Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.

The crew of an Army Air Force bomber arrives in Pearl Harbor in the aftermath of the Japanese attack and is sent on to Manila to help with the defense of the Philippines. This is a Boeing B 17-D they had a **BC-348** communications receiver, which was mass-produced during World War II for the U.S. Army Air Force. Designed as LF/MF/HF receivers for use in larger aircraft (B-17, B-24, B-25, B-26, B-29, C-47, etc.), they were initially paired with a **BC-375** transmitter in the **SCR-287-A** system. Late in World War II, the AN/ARR-11 (BC-348) was the receiver and the AN/ART-13A (ART-13) was the transmitter in the AN/ARC-8 system.
