MIDDLEBORO YMCA CAMP YOMECHAS TRIATHLON

The Massasoit Amateur Radio Association volunteered to provide communication support for the Middleboro YMCA Triathlon held on Sunday, July 7, 2013. **Carl Aveni N1FY** had put out an open invitation for area HAMs to participate. Members of both the Massasoit Club and the Whitman Amateur Radio Club responded. The weather was clear, sunny and hot with the temperature over 90 degrees by the end of the Triathlon.

The Triathlon involved a 1 mile swim in Lake Tispaquin, a 24 mile bike race (four loops around the race course), and a 6 mile run. Some teams split up the swimming, biking and running.

The Triathlon started in waves with the elite participants entering the water at about 8 a.m. and the lead runner finishing in a little over 2 hours. The slower but determined participants took between 4 and 5 hours to finish.

The race started at 8:00 a.m. and because the start area is so crowded, the Radio Team met at 7:00 a.m. at the Dunkin Donuts. Rt. 105 and 28. to get assignments.

Carl N1FY set up Net Control at the Start / Finish line and all the other Radio Team members were located at various intersections around the 6 mile course.

Carl N1FY reports: "I don't have the exact numbers but race officials stated they were down probably because it was the 4th of July weekend plus it was so hot. No major incidents happened; just a few blisters and scrapes. Part way through the race, we were alerted by national weather of potential severe thunderstorms arriving as early as 1:00 p.m."

New Logbook of The World Software Eases Uploading

The recently released version of Trusted QSL (TQSL) software for

Logbook of The World (LoTW) makes it much easier for users to upload logs to the worldwide contact repository. *TQSL* v. 1.14.1 may be downloaded from the LoTW page. The new software lets users upload log files to LoTW *directly* from *Trusted QSL*, saving steps. It also will automatically check for updates, prompting users to download and install. Among other new features, any QSOs that have been successfully uploaded to LoTW or saved to a file are registered in a database, and exact duplicates are automatically stripped from future logs (this feature may be disabled). More than a half-billion contact records have been posted in LoTW since it began operation in 2003, resulting in some 72 million contact confirmations. Upgrading to version 1.14 is not mandatory. <u>Full information</u> on the advantages of upgrading is available on the LoTW website.

ISRAEL, 4X. Members of the Israel Amateur Radio Club (IARC) will activate 4X19MG in honor of the 19th Maccabiah Games from July 18 to 30. QSL via 4Z1TL.

CYPRUS, 5B. Tony, RT9T will be QRV as 5B4ALB from July 6 to 16. Activity will be on all bands and modes. QSL via RT9T direct only. Tony will also participate in the IARU HF Championships as a member of the P3N team.

RWANDA, 9X. Operators Allan, G3XAQ, Nick, G3RWF and possibly others will be active as 9X0XA and 9X0NH, respectively, during the CQWW DX CW Contest. QSL both call signs via G3SWH.

UKRAINE, UR. Members of the Ukrainian Radioamateur QRP Club are celebrating their 15th anniversary and will activate special call sign EO15QRP from July 12 to August 12. QSL via UT2AB, via the Bureau or direct.

FERNANDO DE NORONHA, PY0F. Leo, PP1CZ will be QRV from July 25 to 30. He will be active as PY0F/PP1CZ and taking part in the RSGB IOTA Contest. Before and after the contest Leo will be on the newer bands, mostly CW and RTTY with some SSB.

ECUADOR, HD. Members of the Quito Radio Club (HC1QRC) will be operating as HD082QRC from July 13 to 23 to celebrate its 82nd anniversary. Activity will be on 160 to 2 meters using CW, SSB and RTTY. QSL via HC1JQ direct.

CHINA, BA. Ma, BA4MY will be active as BA4MY/4 from Jiming Island from July 21 to 29. Activity will be on the HF bands. He will also be an entry in the RSGB IOTA Contest. QSL via BA4EG direct, by the Bureau, LoTW or eQSL.

FAROE ISLANDS, OY. Ulf, DL3UB will be QRV as OY/DL3UB from July 29 to August 9. Activity will be holiday style, primarily using CW on 30, 17 and 12 meters. QSL via this home call sign, direct or via the Bureau.

CHILE, CE. A group of operators will be QRV as XR77RG during the month of July to commemorate the 77th anniversary of the Radio Club Rancagua. Activity will be on all bands using SSB and PSK. QSL via CE4RG. In addition, a group of operators will be QRV as XR3PN during the month of July to commemorate the birth of Chilean poet and diplomat Pablo Neruda. Activity will be on all bands using SSB, RTTY and PSK. QSL via CE30EV.

SWEDEN, SJ. Eric, SM1TDE will operate as SJ1SOP for the "Sea Of Peace" (SOP) award until July 31. Activity will be CW only on 160 to 6 meters. During the RSGB IOTA Contest, Eric will be signing SA1A from Gotland Island (SM1), IOTA EU-020. QSL via SM1TDE, preferably by the Bureau.
