



ARRL NEWS

The Amateur Radio Parity Act of 2015 (or H.R. 1301) was recently introduced in the US House of Representatives. You may recall that with your help we were able to sign up more than 60 co-sponsors for the same legislation last year before the Congress adjourned. We're back working on it again in the new Congress. This means we need you to contact your representative and request his/her support.

This legislation offers Amateur Radio the best chance for us to deal with antenna restrictions in decades. While PRB-1 has been very effective in dealing with local, state and federal restrictions for private property, it did not address the needs of the thousands of licensed hams living in property (~25 million housing units nationwide) restricted by CC&Rs (covenants, conditions, and restrictions) that are usually present in condominium and subdivisions. HR-1301 will open the door to discussions about reasonable accommodation.

Several New England House members have already signed on as co-sponsors:



The K7RA Solar Update


The K7RA Solar Update

Tad Cook, K7RA, Seattle, reports: Solar activity strengthened during the past week. Average daily sunspot numbers increased from 34.3 to 112.4, and average daily solar flux rose from 97.8 to 131.4. We can only guess at the middle latitude A index for June 10-11, due to some sort of outage that deprives us of K index data over a 27-hour period. The outage began sometime after 1200 UTC on June 9 and ended sometime before 1800 UTC on June 10.

June 8 was the day with the greatest geomagnetic upset, when the planetary A index rose to 33.

Predicted planetary A index for the near term is 8, 20, and 14 on June 11-13, then 15, 10, and 8 on June 14-16, then 5 on June 17 through July 3. We'll then see another active period for July 4-9, when the predicted A index is 8, 20, 28, 20, 10, and 8.

At 0202 UTC on June 10 the Australian Space Forecast Centre predicted increased geomagnetic activity on June 12, due to a coronal mass ejection. The Centre issued a second warning at 0336 UTC, predicting a glancing blow at Earth early in the UTC day on June 12.



Predicted solar flux for the near term is 135 on June 11-13, then 130, 125, 120, and 115 on June 14-17, 120 on June 18-26, 115 on June 27, and 120 for June 28-29. The forecast then shows solar flux rising to 145 for July 5-7.



Frequency is a 2000 American science fiction thriller film. It was co-produced and directed by Gregory Hoblit and written and co-produced by Toby Emmerich. The film stars Dennis Quaid and Jim Caviezel as father and son, Frank and John Sullivan respectively

In Queens, New York during October 1999, John Sullivan (Caviezel), a 36-year-old homicide detective, breaks up with his girlfriend Samantha (Melissa Errico) with the reason partially attributed to the trauma caused by the death of his fireman father Frank (Quaid). Still living in the same house where he grew up, he discovers his father's Heathkit single-sideband ham radio and begins transmitting radio signals. Because of highly localized electro-temporal spatial effects caused by unusual aurora borealis activity, John somehow makes contact with his father exactly 30 years in the past on the day before Frank's death in a warehouse fire. The ensuing conversation results in Frank thinking John is a stalker. Before the connection cuts out, John is able to shout out the circumstances that led to Frank's death. The next day as little things brought up in their conversation prove true, Frank believes and heeds John's words, escaping the fire to safety. The father and son reconnect on the HAM radio set later that evening, with Frank sharing his dreams and his hopes for his son, and John recounting the details of the Mets-Orioles World Series, which is just beginning in Frank's timeline in 1969.

Original Dennis Quaid and Jim Caviezel screen used hero Ham Radio prop from "Frequency (2000)". This Ham Radio is definitely a star by its own right due to it's screen time and amount of usage involved in this movie, and this is the only link that made the entirely story of communication between two different time lines a possibility.
