Field Day: 2012 Field Day Packet Now Available

It's that time of year again -- time to start gearing up for ARRL Field Day, June 23-24, 2012! ARRL's flagship operating event -- always held the fourth full weekend in June -- brings together new and experienced hams for 24 hours of operating fun. Field Day packets are now <u>available for download</u> and include the complete rules, as well as other reference items such as forms, ARRL Section abbreviation list, entry submission instructions, a Frequently Asked Questions section, guidelines for getting bonus points, instructions for GOTA stations and a kit to publicize your event with the local press. A brief one-page flyer with basic "What is Field Day" information has also been included in this year's Field Day packet. Amateur Radio clubs and individuals are encouraged to reproduce this flyer as a handout for information tables.

Payroll Tax Bill Includes Provision for Amateur Radio Study

A bill that passed both the House and the Senate on February 17 -- and signed into law by President Obama on Wednesday, February 22 -- includes a provision for a study of the uses and capabilities of Amateur Radio Service communications in emergencies and disaster relief.

Section 6414 of the *Middle Class Tax Relief and Job Creation Act of 2012* mandates the completion of the study, with a report of the findings to the House Committee on Energy and Commerce and the Senate Committee on Commerce, Science, and Transportation. This study would "use the expertise of stakeholder entities and organizations" to recommend how to best use radio amateurs in emergency communications and disaster relief efforts, and how to best utilize the Amateur Radio Service in coordination with the federal government in these efforts. In addition, the study would also discuss the effects of unreasonable or unnecessary private land use restrictions on residential antenna installations and recommend ways to remove such impediments.

The bill passed in the House by a vote of 293-132. In the Senate, it passed by a 60-36 vote

On the Air: Republic of South Sudan Assigned Z8 Prefix

After a wait of more than seven months after being accepted as a member of the United Nations, the Republic of South Sudan received its prefix block from the International Telecommunication Union (ITU): Z8. On July 14, 2011 -- after South Sudan's admittance to the UN -- the new country became a DXCC entity by way of Section II, 1(a) of the DXCC rules.

ARRL Publishes New Guidelines for 60 Meters

Thanks to the FCC's <u>Report and Order</u> issued November 18, 2011, radio amateurs will enjoy a number of new privileges on the 60 meter band, beginning at midnight (EST) March 5. These new privileges include a boost in effective radiated power from 50 to 100 W, as well as the ability to use CW and certain digital modes.

Late last year, the ARRL HF Band Planning Committee surveyed 60 meter operators to gather opinions about how to best use the new privileges. On the subject of creating a specific band plan, the survey results indicated little consensus beyond the fact that 5403.5 kHz should retain its status as a *de facto* "DX channel." On the other hand, survey respondents made a number of suggestions for general operating practices.

Based on the survey results and subsequent research, the committee declined to propose a specific band plan for 60 meters at this time. Instead, the committee created a "Recommended Practices" document (click here for the document). The 60 meter pages on the ARRL website have been updated to reflect the changes brought about by the Report and Order.

The April issue of *QST* will also include an article by ARRL Regulatory Information Manager Dan Henderson, N1ND, offering a detailed discussion of the new 60 meter privileges and recommended operating practices.

MEMA's New Auxiliary Communications System

The Massachusetts Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) has implemented a new Auxiliary Communications System (ACS) to operate MEMA's radio

system. ACS will replace the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES) as the primary communications organization serving MEMA. Acting State RACES Officer Mike Neilsen, W1MPN, outlined the changes at a statewide meeting in Sutton, MA on Feb. 25, 2012.

While MEMA relies primarily on the Web-based WEB EOC system for reporting and communications, ACS volunteers will operate MEMA's backup radio network that operates on non-amateur frequencies. The volunteers will not be required to hold Amateur Radio licenses.

Amateur Radio will continue to play an important part in disaster intelligence gathering through its SKYWARN program and MEMA has asked Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) leadership to help develop the new ACS program, criteria and training for delivering damage reports from the local cities and towns to MEMA.

Regional EMA headquarters will continue to operate, and RACES operations will continue in the cities and towns that support the Plymouth, Seabrook and Vermont Yankee Nuclear Power Plant Evacuation Plans. According to Neilsen, "these same RACES operators will likely continue to be involved with ACS at the local town and city level in other disaster related scenarios at the discretion of the Emergency Management Agency Director."
