Emergency Operations Drill—October 10, 2012


An emergency operations drill has been scheduled for 7:00 pm on 10 October 2012 at the EOC.

The SET is one of the premier events of the year that invites the Amateur Radio Emergency Service, the National Traffic System, the Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service, SKYWARN, members of the ARRL Field Organization and other groups to work in concert together to practice and prepare.

QSL Card of the Month By: Barry Kennedy N1EZH Special Coast Guard Tribute to George Manning K1CG (SK)





The Coast Guard Operators Association secured the call sign **K1CG** and created a memorial QSL card honoring RMCM **George Manning** USCG Ret. **George SK** was the original holder of the **K1CG** call sign and lived in Pembroke, MA.

The QSL card reads: "George A. Manning, RMCM USCG ret. ZUT 1325. Born 14 July 1931 and crossed the bar on 28 March 2010. The Master chief was a fine Coast

Guard radio telegrapher and an active member of the Coast Guard CW Operators Association. He was a gentleman and a friend to all that knew him."

The **K1CG** QSL card was used during the Coast Guard 222 birthday Special Event. Whitman Club member **Barry Kennedy N1EZH** was a **K1CG** Special Event Operator on August 5, 2012.

Barry N1EZH reports: "After reading some information and hearing stories from area HAMs who knew RMCM George Manning SK personally in the weeks leading up to our Special Event, I learned that, among many other things, George SK was stationed at U. S. Coast Guard Communication Station Boston for a couple of tours of duty.



I served two tours of active duty at Commsta Boston, first as an ET3 right out of ET "A" School on Governor's

Island, NY (Where I received my Amateur Radio License) in 1978 and again where I retired as an ETC and the Executive Petty Officer in 1997.

This was an honor and a privilege to have been given the opportunity to be a Special Event Station Operator in the memory of **George SK** during the US Coast Guard's 222nd Birthday. I cannot think of a more fitting tribute to keep **George's SK** Call Sign – **K1CG**, and his dedication to both the US Coast Guard CW Operators Association and Amateur Radio alive during this Special Event.

I received a Certificate for being a Special Event Operator from the CG CW Operators Association and the CG Amateur Radio Club, **W5CGC** of which I am a member, and from which this Special Event came about.

ARRL Centennial Convention 2014

In case you haven't heard, the League will hold its Centennial Convention in Hartford, Connecticut, July 17-20, 2014. The Convention will mark 100 years of the ARRL's founding in Hartford. The theme for ARRL's Centennial year is "Advancing the Art and Science of Radio -- since 1914."
